CAPTAINS REPORT

Another month of golf provided another month of good times on the golf course.

November saw the preliminary rounds of the Match Play Championships across all grades with the final scheduled to be played on Saturday 8th December. There are some very interesting match ups in the final and all players will need to be on top of their game if they are looking to win.

Another successful Diggers Day was held to remember our past and present war veterans. While all of these days are special, this year had the added significance of being the 100th anniversary of the ending of the First World War. On behalf of all members, our thanks go to the Diggers Committee and their helpers for the work they put into Diggers Day at Cumberland every year. The 2nd Inaugural

Cumberland Par 3 Championship was again booked out for a challenging day of golf. The ladies continued to show their strength in this event with Keum Yoo having 42pts to win the trophy on a count back from Kay Park. The scratch score was won by Phil Britton with 32pts on a count back. Several improvements were implemented this year which included a specific par 3 slope rating bringing scores back to a more conventional outcome and a faster round of golf through calling up on all holes.

The 2018 Medal of Medals has been won by Stephen Couper with a fine nett 68. Congratulations Steve.

The Christmas Cup is scheduled for Wednesday 12th December with only Cumberland Members eligible to win the Cup. On this day hams will be awarded as prizes in lieu of a House Account credit. This is normally the biggest Wednesday competition of the year so make sure you are booked in early to secure a spot.

The first three months of the 2019 Fixture Book has been on the Members Portal for several months. The remainder of the year will be added to the portal in the near future.

Cumberland will be hosting a round of the Volkswagen Scramble (previously Holden Scramble) in February. Denlo Volkswagen Parramatta are our local sponsors for the day and are offering competitors a significant discount on car purchases and a prize of a car for a Hole in One. VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

November has proved a challenging month for our Course staff. Several days of gale force winds and the recent rain event, which saw around 70 millilitres fall on the course. Resources are stretched as staff work hard to have the course in

playable condition. Fortunately, the amount of damage has been relatively minor, with one large eucalyptus tree the only large tree felled by the wind.

Several trees will be removed shortly. To enable completion of the bunker project work on the 13th hole, two trees behind the left hand side bunker will be removed. The third tree will be cut to a size, with limbs removed, suitable to house a bird colony. Two replacement trees will be planted near the Whalans Road boundary. The large eucalyptus on the right hand side of the 8th hole, roughly 170 metres from the green, is to be removed. This tree is hit regularly by members and following external advice the tree is to be removed. A replacement tree will be planted.

The eucalyptus tree behind the 7th green, which died some months ago, will be subject to the same reduction exercise as I referred to above on the 13th hole to cater for nesting birds. A replacement eucalyptus will be planted near the existing tree. In the next edition of the e-news, I will cover more issues on the Course tree population.

In addition to the normal work activity, over the next few months Course staff will be undertaking irrigation works and the next phase of the Bare Patches Programme. A priority is the improvement in the Course surrounds out to approximately 10 metres from the putting surface. Some green surrounds were not receiving sufficient water to promote adequate grass coverage. The first step in correcting this problem will be the laying of additional irrigation lines linked to the existing watering systems. Further work will be required in the next financial year to improve water coverage around the course.

In the last e-news, I touched on the influence of couch grass on our course. The ground pearl insect is widespread and testing of Santa Anna couch grass is demonstrating resistance qualities to the destructive insect. Couch grass used on the Course has achieved satisfactory results and as we finalise this years' Bare Patches Programme, consideration will be given to expanding the couch grass coverage.

Couch grass achieves the best results in areas with below average water

coverage and on some areas of the course, couch grass has replaced kikuyu on fairways and near rough. The couch grass will spread until such time as our irrigation systems can provide the opportunity for kikuyu grass to be established. Healthy kikuyu with adequate watering will be better able to resist the ground pearl and is strong enough to replace couch grass.

To assist our Course staff with completion of the Bare Patches Programme in a timely manner, volunteer help is required. I am pleased to have received from a few members, a commitment to assist. However, the Club can do with more help on this programme. Please let me know or alternatively the office if you can assist.

On the subject of volunteers, our Garden Club volunteers are badly in need of more helpers. If you can assist on a Friday morning, please let me know.
