Make sure all foot marks in a bunker are raked before leaving the bunker.

I thank you for your patience during recent works at the club, particularly to the front entrance. The toilet at the far end of the restaurant has now been converted to a Unisex Disabled suite and renovations to the front entrance have been made to allow for the inclusion of a lifting device to allow for better access for those with

mobility issues.

The Chick of the Walk Matchplay is currently underway. Good luck to all competing. The final will be played on Tuesday 18/6.


# **Upcoming Events -**



# Knowledge

One of the major causes of bad chipping is a poor relationship between the club and the ground (the big ball). This is largely dictated by your setup position. When golfers are faced with a golf ball sitting down in the grass the tendency is to move the ball toward their back foot and push their hands out in front of the ball in an attempt to hit down into the back of the ball. This is demonstrated in the image below right and dramatically reduces your margin for error.



#### Simple Setup Key.

Without the ball, there's no bad lie and most golfers will naturally use a neutral setup. Weight equally distributed between both feet but slightly favouring the front foot (60/40), ball positioned equally between both feet, and, the clubs shaft perpendicular (at a right angle) to the ground. This is demonstrated in the image below left and looks similar to how you stand to a putt. This neutral setup position will encourage the sole of the club to glide on impact with the ground.

#### Practice Tip.

Practice your chipping with just one ball and avoid giving yourself perfect lies. Take two practice swings brushing the grass and bring the same setup into the ball, feel the brush as the ball simply gets in the way of your swing. After a few attempts you will feel how the clubs bounce/sole angle is helping you glide along the earths surface without forcing the leading edge to dig and get stuck.
